A favorite way to wind down after a long week or a popular backyard party point, a hot tub makes a great addition to your yard or deck. Personal spas are also popular for their hydrotherapy benefits. Many people with muscle pain and joint pain find the soothing feeling of a hot tub to help relax both the body and mind while promoting a sense of health. The hot tub uses a heating element to warm water temperatures up to 100 degrees, creating a wet spa pot for you to slide into. In addition, jets are available that direct a stream of water into tired muscles or back pain. The center of a hot tub is a pump (or in some cases two pumps) that keeps water moving through filters, heater, and jet system for a spa feel in your very own backyard. Jet Orientation allows you to adjust the position of the water flow to target specific points where you want some extra jet action. The pulsator jet has a rotation center part to change the current coming out- creating a pulse effect. Multi-massage jets feature several holes to create individual, high pressure streams of water. Cluster jets are one of the most basic jets and often do not have adjustable or visible nozzles - they point a stream of water into a hot tub. If your hot tub is equipped with an ozonator, then a cluster jet (also known as an ozone jet) is used to send ozone gas into spa water to keep things clean and fresh. The number of jets you choose will be determined by personal preferences and budgets. Typically, more jets will translate into higher price tags. Some people like to experience Spa is more serene and wants minimal jets. On the other hand, if you are looking for a hydrotherapy massage experience, then more jets in more places will suit your needs better. Don't be fooled by extra jets in places where you can't afford to feel or appreciate them. Some hot tub manufacturers include additional jets to increase the appeal of a model, despite the placed embarrassingly or without adding real value to the spa experience. This brings us to a point of interest - jet position. As mentioned above, the location of the water jet will have a big impact on the type of massage you will enjoy when using your spa. A pump with too much or too little energy will lead to poor jet performance due to a pressure imbalance. Some hot tubs with multiple jets will consist of two pumps to ensure that the system can keep up with the extra demand. Some of the most popular options on the market include LEDs, water features and integrated floating sound systems. LEDs for your hot tub will provide air light while gently illuminating the water. Some lighting systems also include effects, such as random colors for an interesting light show in your spa. Don't confuse water features with jets. Instead of being below the surface, water features including cascading waterfalls and streams add to the spa's own appearance and atmosphere. Each of these items will add aesthetics to your hot tub but will not affect the performance of your spa. If there is room in your budget for them, they make the supplement interesting. However, don't let these extras break the bank during your spa shopping trip. Electric Hook-Up: Hot tubs are usually wired to operate with either 220 volts of electricity or 110 volts. Hot tubs can be plugged into 110-volt sockets commonly known as 'plug-and-play' models. While a hot tub can connect to your standard household socket with 110 volts of electricity that provides convenient installation, it can have significant shortcomings in energy and heating capabilities. These hot tubs will generally need to be on a dedicated circuit, and they are often unable to operate heating units and pumps simultaneously. It also takes longer for the heater to warm the water and it requires more running time to maintain the proper temperature. As a result, 110-volt hot tubs are usually smaller units. If you want more features, jet power, and heating capabilities, look for a hot tub with wiring for 220 volts. Although you will need an electrician to assist with the installation, you will achieve better and more power in return. Many people find that the 220-volt hot tub provides better temperature regulation, stronger jets, and increased efficiency when compared to 110-volt models. Pumps: Some hot tubs have a variable speed pump, while others may be equipped with two or more separate handling pumps the filtering and action jets. Since filtration requires lower circulation speed, the pump uses less energy when it only performs this function. High-power jets, however, require the pump to take things up a notch. So variable speed pumps can kick it into high gear to ensure that you have a strong spa experience. The number of pumps you need in a hot tub depends on a variety of factors, including the size of the hot tub and the number of jets it has. Larger hot tubs with increased water volume and more jets will benefit from stronger or more pumps. However, it is important to know what continuous horsepower is of a pump, since many manufacturers only advertise peak horsepower generated when the pump powers on, which quickly decreases once the pump is running. When shopping for a hot tub, you will most likely be considering either installation or inflatable models. The hot tub installed will be set up on your chosen spot - usually on the yard, deck, cement pads or other solid surface. There are several types of hot tubs installed to choose from, but the differences are mainly related to the material and the construction of the bathtub. When it's time to deeply clean your hot tub, it is wise to use a flush line of detergents to ensure that you don't let biofilms grow in plumbing. Otherwise, bacteria can easily over-grow in water currents as they feed on biofilms and seek refuge from the chemicals you're counting on to keep things hygienical. Once the lines are flush and the bathtubs is empty, you will want to use a cleaner spray hot tub on the shell of your spa to clean the entire surface. Then it's time to recharge, reheat, and enjoy your sparkling spa! You hope You will enjoy years of free hassle use from your hot tub. But if an issue arises, it pays to carefully consider the terms of the warranty before making a decision on your purchase. There are many ingredients together to power your spa and often these systems are covered by separate warranty parameters. Pay attention to the warranty terms for casings and structures, cabinets, pump(s), heater(s), plumbing and other components. Typical warranty periods range from 2 to 10 years or up to lifetime. Many leading manufacturers stand behind their casings and structures for at least 10 years but offer a more limited warranty period of 5 years or less on heaters and other components.
